INTRODUCTION

I have always wondered how a man with no more than a high school level of education can hardly speak a word in English, and with only a few thousand dollars, can come into a western a business and democracy, start become a millionaire after five or so years. Further, it still baffles me how a man who has a University level of perfect English, and education, speaks thousands of dollars at his disposal to operate a business in the same democratic system but cannot make it in business. My father was a businessman who had no more than a secondary or high school level of education, but by the time he was in his forties, he had made his first million and was one of the few millionaires in my country. This was during the 1970s. I was raised up living on top of eight different factories that my father had built. All of which he had started from scratch and built up to be leading businesses in my country. Among the businesses that my father began was a store, a bread factory, a biscuit factory, a lolly factory, a printing press, a paint factory, a meat factory, and a coconut cream factory. There were other businesses that my father went into partnership with others, but his dying aspiration was to start a bank, which eventuated after his death.

My father had no special training in any of the businesses he started, nor did he have any formal education in business, but he had a way of acquiring friends who would help him start these ventures. Many would put my father's success to luck or chance, others to his business accruement or others to his foresight, and still acquaintances or contacts. However, I have come to discover that the real secret of my father's success did not lie in any of these factors, although it had assisted him; but it was in his ability to see farther and before others could see in his time. We call this VISION. My father was a man of vision, which enabled him to be a step ahead of many of his time's business companions. Most of my father's operations were not original in concept or idea but were unique in my country. Over the years, I have witnessed many business graduates from foreign Universities; return home to my country only to of their vears working spend the rest Government departments or business people who, like my father, had no University level of education. Not that there is anything wrong with this.

Vision gives us the ability to see farther and before others do in our time. My wife and I recently had a wonderful opportunity to travel to the Islands of the South Seas to do a documentary for a Christian Television Network of which

we are part. Our travels took us to the Solomon Islands, Vanuatu, Fiji, Tonga, Samoa, and the Cook

Islands. In each of these countries, we noticed a distinct group of individuals who had come into these Island nations from foreign nations and set up a business and were now monopolizing many of the trade and industry in these Islands. In some countries like Fiji and the Solomon Islands, 90 percent of the business activities were dominated by immigrants instead of native Islanders. Being a native Islander of Samoan and English descent and a local businessman, I was intrigued by how this had happened and why fewer native citizens of these countries were in business. I knew the difficulties of a foreigner coming in and establishing a business was far more significant than a native citizen of that country. For one thing, a foreigner had a language barrier and a cultural barrier to overcome than a native citizen did not have. Furthermore, foreigners had more Government red tape to overcome than the local people had to face.

Like my father, many of these business immigrants had only a secondary or high school level of education. If they had a degree, it was in an area with no relevance in business. For instance, one man I met who had become a multi-millionaire had initially entered my country as a medical doctor but was now a very successful retailer. Some of these immigrants still could not speak English and found it more comfortable conversing in the native language. I could not imagine what could have brought these people to the Islands, but it was apparent that they succeeded in an area where the native people were not. What was it that caused these people to succeed and had sustained them in obviously a challenging environment? The answer is vision.

Some of us may contend that it was because these foreigners had the money or the influence or the experience that was the driving force that made them successful. The truth is money, influence, and experience can only take a person so far, but the rest of the way, it has to be something far more powerful and enduring than what we bring with us that fortifies a person never to give in or give up. CHAPTER ONE

I have a plague in my father's house that states, "A fool and his money are soon parted." Money in the hands of a man who has a vision is a powerful combination, but money in the hands of a man who has no vision is a foolish combination. Even worse still is money in the hands of a man who is an educated fool. An education is a good thing to have, but it is certainly not a quarantee that you will succeed. In fact, most of the problems we have in the World today were created by educated people. The more educated we have become, the more difficult it has become to solve the many political, social, and economic problems we have in the World today. Therefore, the answer does not lie in how many letters we place behind our names on a business card but in understanding the revolutionary power of vision. Show me any successful man in the World today who is leading in any field of endeavor, and I will prove to you that man has a vision. Show me any successful woman in the World today who is leading in any field of endeavor, and I will prove to you that woman has a vision. The driving force behind any successful person in the past or the present, or the future, has been and is and will be vision.

The driving force behind any successful person in the past or the present, or the future, has been and will be vision. We have many gifted and talented artists in our little region of the World. Most of them will never get international recognition for their gift and talent. However, it

never ceases to amaze me how a man from a primitive bush background with only a rudimentary level of education can carve a wood or stone statute with such precision detail that makes Leonardo Davinci's statutes look like elementary artwork. Just recently, the Maori people of New Zealand were displaying their native artwork in New York, and many marveled at how such a so-called primitive Pacific culture can come up with such intricate and detailed artwork. This is the power of vision. When people are driven by vision, what is to one man, a lifeless stone, or a simple old tree is material for an incredible masterpiece. When a carver who has a vision stands before a tree, in his mind, he sees the statue in the tree as though the tree were made for the statue. In the confines of the carver's mind, the dimensions and curvatures of the statue are not a factor to be discovered or worked out. He already knows what it is, as though the vision downloaded this information into his mind.

The power of vision enables a man to change and shape his environment. You can give a pig farmer

ten thousand dollars and come back a year later, and his farm is no better than what it was the year before. But give that same farmer the ten thousand dollars with a vision, and next year you will see a ham factory. We live in a community, in a society, in a culture, and in a country that was shaped by vision. Whether directly or indirectly, vision has affected and transformed our lives. We will never meet the man who invented the automobile, or the man who invented the airplane, or the man who invented the train because they are all in the grave, but every day our lives are being transformed and improved by their visions. Also, we take for granted the many little conveniences we enjoy that make our lives so much better, for example, a toaster, a coffee machine, a juice blender, a blow dryer, an electric fan, etc. Most of which we cannot do without today. These wonderful little conveniences are all products of vision. In fact, it would not be an exaggeration to state that everything that our five senses can evidence, what we see, hear, taste, feel and smell, is a product of a vision. Everyday vision is touching and shaping our lives, whether you are aware of it or not, or whether you approve of it or not. There is no escape in this World from the touch of vision

Have you ever watched an Eagle fly? They are magnificent creatures to watch. They can glide effortlessly on a desert wind for hours and have you mesmerized. We do not have eagles in our part of the World, but we have a few comparable-sized sea birds that can glide just as effortlessly for hours over miles of deep Blue Ocean. While fishing, I have sometimes sat for hours and watched these masters

of flight glide and slide in the wind. Even though I cannot see the force that drives the bird up and down, I know that the bird is not up there because of an event of chance. The invisible force that lifts the bird into the air is the power of the wind. So it is the same with the soul of a man who has a vision. The invisible force that lifts a man into souring heights in life is the power of vision. The most powerful thing that a man can have is a vision. If you want your personal life transformed, get a vision. If you're going to transform a community or a society, or a nation, give people a vision. The most dangerous thing you can personally do to yourself is to become a visionary. What our World desperately needs today are more visionaries.

I often make a habit of looking at cemeteries when I drive by. The reason being is because I believe that cemeteries are the wealthiest places on Earth. It's not because of the gold or

diamonds that the dead take with them into their graves or the treasures they have hidden in safety deposit boxes or bank accounts they forgot to tell their living relatives, but it is because of the millions of "unrealized visions" that people take with them to their grave. How many of us have had the privilege of being with a loved one on their final days. At this time, the dying often gives an insight into what they had aspired to do or achieve but were not able to because time had run out of time? My father passed away when I was in my thirties, and to my

disappointment, I was not around when he passed. I often think of what my father could have achieved in his life if he only lived another twenty years. One of his dying aspirations was to start a bank, and he died before this vision was realized. A man once made a very powerful statement that has never left me. He said, "when I die, I want to die empty." What he meant was that he wanted to accomplish every vision that he had received before he died. What a way to go!

Many years ago, I met a man and his wife, who has a vision that they would build for GOD a Christian Television Network that would cover the globe. At that time, I was part of their operations to broadcast into the South Pacific, and as a result, they came to visit my tiny Island. Their names were Paul and Jan Crouch, the founder of Trinity Broadcasting Network (TBN), who has since passed away. Here is a little background on their vision. TBN is the world's largest Christian television network and America's most-watched faith-and-family channel. TBN today is a growing family of over thirty global networks reaching every inhabited continent with a broad range of inspirational, entertaining, and life-changing programming twenty-four hours a day. In the U.S., TBN's family of networks is available to 98 percent of television households, and globally TBN reaches an estimated two billion potential viewers each day! Matt Crouch their son currently serves as TBN's president and head of operations.

When I met Paul Crouch his operation was not as far reaching as it is today, I could see that a powerful vision drove this man and his wife. I understood he

would not go to the grave until he had achieved his dream, and he did it and surpassed it to the glory of GOD. It was through Paul Crouch that I got involved in television and radio broadcasting for many years. I am forever thankful for the many gifts they gave to me.

don't know why people make things complicated these days; I guess people need to have jobs so that they can sell this, buy that, borrow this or lend that to get busy. The truth is all we need to get is vision, and believe it or not! It does not cost you anything to get a vision. The fact is without vision, people don't go anywhere, and people who are heading somewhere are driven by vision. Most Governments believe that we need more education, while most Law Makers believe that we need more laws and most Religions believe that we need more religion, while most Industries believe that we need more stuff, vet when we look at the World today, there are more economic problems, more wars, more crime, and more unhappy people today even though education, law, religion, and commodities have increased by 1000 percent since the middle ages. What we don't need is more products but for people to have vision and not any vision but visions that have character because not all vision will have character.

CHAPTER TWO

The Character of Vision

All sorts of people go fishing these days, but there are really only two types of fishermen. One who knows what he is doing and one who thinks he knows what he is doing. What distinguishes "the know" from "the think" is not the type of tackle box or brand of fishing rod they are using but the character and the nature of their vision. Two fishermen arrive at the dock with a vision to catch fish, at least most fishermen do, but one walks away with a bucket full of fish and the other with a fish story. Why did one fisherman succeed and the other fail? The difference between success and failure lies in the character of their vision. The character can be briefly defined as the spine or backbone of something. The vision characters are those underlying internal qualities that make up the spine or backbone of the vision. A vision that has character will always have these three immutable and universal qualities. The vision will have:

- 1 A HEART.
- 2 A PURPOSE.
- 3 & A DESTINY.

The *Heart* of the vision

The heart of the vision is the DREAM that inspired and created the vision. Every vision has a dreamer who has a dream that inspires the visionary. The dream is the source that creates the visionary, but it is the visionary who has the vision to fulfill the dream. Hence the heart of vision is the dream.

Dreamer \longrightarrow Dream \longrightarrow Visionary \longrightarrow Vision

The heart of the vision is the DREAM that inspired and created the vision.

In the early nineteenth century, around the 1800s, a host of European settlers migrated to the Pacific Islands. What on

Earth motivated these people to come to these islands with little or nothing to offer them except an inexhaustible supply of coconuts and sand? This had always intrigued me? One of these settlers was my great, great, great grandfather, who came from Wales, England. He boarded a schooner somewhere in Wales and went to the Islands with a dream to make it as a trader. I do not doubt that it was his parents who had first put this dream into his heart because of the so many success stories that were circulating in England from her newly founded colonies of America, Australia, and New Zealand. The news had leaked out that the newest frontier were the Islands, and they were ready for the

picking. No one in his right mind would just board a boat and come to the Pacific unless they were inspired by something greater than themselves; a dream.

It was not long before my great, great, great grandfather found himself a native wife, my great, great, great grandmother, and started a store and a small bakery. Their dream impacted and inspired my father to start a bakery and a biscuit factory. Other settlers who had come during the same time as my great grandfather also areat. started businesses and are now the leading business families in my country. These founding fathers from England or Europe or Asia came to the Pacific with a dream that is the catalyst of today's visionaries. Martin Luther King coined and popularised that immortal phrase, "I have a dream," and what a dream this man had. America had decreed in its Constitution that all men were created free and egual. When Martin Luther King made, this statement blacks and whites were still legally segregated as late as the 1960s, yet emancipation of slavery occurred in America in 1865. That dream birthed a tremendous political movement in America and birthed thousands of black and white activists who have championed the cause of freedom in America to this day. The dream was what created and inspired the visionaries, and it was the visionaries who moved the mountains.

It is essential that we see this distinction between a dreamer and a visionary before going further. A dreamer is the source or the nest from which the visionaries are birthed. The dreamers are the

mothers and fathers of visionaries. The visionary, the child, is the resource that fulfills the dream. Dreamers rarely ever get fully acknowledged for their contribution because their contribution is often intangible and in the background. They are the ones who persist with you when everyone else said, "you cannot do it, or it is not possible"; they are the ones who break down the so-called walls of myths and legends that previous people had created to justify their failures. Any person who has had a positive and life-changing influence on you was the dreamer that inspired you to be the visionary you are today. Some of today's greatest visionaries were born on the lap of a grandfather or a grandmother or in the classroom of a teacher or a coach who never gave up on them despite what everybody else said about them. There is always that special person or persons whose actions are directly responsible for the visionaries of yesterday and today.

A dreamer is the source or the nest from which the visionaries are birthed. The dreamers are the mothers and fathers of visionaries. Why dreamers never turn into visionaries is not really important because we will always need our

dreamers. The visionaries' mistake in life is not to acknowledge or reward the dreamer for their dream. For some of us, it may not be possible to do this because this particular dreamer or dreamers may no longer be around, but it should never stop us from acknowledging their contribution in some way. For instance, a Memorabilia dedicated in their honor to the building they inspired you to build. A letter of acknowledgment framed in the foyer of your office,

buying a brick in their honor at the dedication of a building, publishing an article in the newspapers acknowledging their contribution, dedicating a book in their honor, etc. There are literally hundreds of creative ways one can recognize the contribution of these dreamers. On the other hand, no real dreamer will tell a visionary that they want to be acknowledged because this was never the reason. If a dreamer ever seeks acknowledgment from a visionary for their contribution, they are likely to have never really influenced the visionary. The dreamers that inspired my father were, no doubt, my grandfather and grandmother.

The *Purpose* of the vision

Purpose can be defined as the intended end or result of an action. A vision must have an intended end or result. A vision without a purpose is a vision that has no character. Anything that has no character, i.e. spine or backbone, will not last the distance. It is crucial that we know and understand the purpose of the vision. This should be clear at the outset of the vision and not something that we are struggling to identify later in the vision. During the time when my father was contemplating starting a bakery and biscuit factory, many other business people in my country had a similar vision, but only two men succeeded at that time. At that time, the monetary and economic conditions were basically the same for everyone in my country. If you had some freehold land, you could borrow some money and start a business. My father's success had nothing to do with his time's prevailing economic or monetary factors, but it had to do with the fact that

he had a clear purpose to his vision. My father may not have had the most admirable and honorable purpose, but because he had a purpose, and it made all the difference to his vision.

My father's purpose was threefold. First, he wanted to be a millionaire; second, he wanted to provide a better future for his

family; and third, he wanted to do better than his father had done and proved him wrong. We all have our reasons, but these reasons are the very purpose why the vision eventuates, and it is perpetuated to succeeding generations but not necessarily why it succeeds or fails. Some people have a wrong purpose to their vision, yet they succeed, and some people have a good purpose to their visions, yet they fail. Purpose of itself does not guarantee that a vision will succeed, but what it does is put a perspective or a goal into the vision that will ensure its long-term survival. Without a purpose in your vision, the vision will become meaningless. When something is meaningless, it will not have an aim or a goal or a reason for its existence. Every activity that occurs in the realm of nature has a purpose to it. Things do not happen because of chance despite some evolutionary claims. There is a purpose why a leaf loses its glory and falls gracefully to the ground. There is a purpose why rocks break down into pebbles then decay into meaningless sand. We may not understand its mechanics, but we know that it is necessary for life to continue to exist. So is a purpose to the life of the vision.

A vision that has an outward-looking purpose envisages the good of others over the good of its founders. An inward-looking vision will always seek the primary good of itself or its founders over betterment of others.

When the vision has character, it will have an outward-looking purpose, and when a vision does not have character, it will have an inward-looking purpose. A vision that has an

outward-looking purpose envisages the good of others over the good of its founders. An inwardlooking vision will always seek the primary good of itself or its founders over others' betterment. A vision with an outward purpose improves, changes for the good or impacts for the good, the state or condition or wellbeing of others. Consider, for example, two men who both have a simple vision to buy a car. The purpose of one man in buying his car is for his job and his family. The other man's purpose for buying a car is for show and himself. The purpose of their vision determines the destiny of their vision. The man who buys his car for his job and family has the greater good of others in mind, while the man who buys his car for himself only has his good in mind. Thus, the first man has an outward-looking vision, and the second man has an inward-looking vision. The outward-looking vision impacts and improves the condition of others, while the inward-looking vision benefits only itself. Which of these visions had a destiny?

Now it is entirely possible to have a vision without a purpose. Take, for example, a young man who happens to be a nephew of mine who is a very

bright and capable young man. Six years ago, he embarked on a University education. A quarter way through his degree, he changes his mind and starts another degree; halfway through this degree, he switches to another degree. I am sure you have this sort in your own family. After sitting down with my nephew and looking back at his track record, it does not take a genius to figure out that this young man had no purpose. He had a vision to receive a University degree, but what kind of degree was something he never sorted out. What was the result of this? A purposeless or meaningless vision. What was the cost of this? Wasted opportunity and money. Unfortunately, this is a common problem among University entrants today, and there is a cost to these meaningless visions. During my University years, nearly all of my classmates I had gone to secondary or high school graduated with-in the standard three years. We all had a purpose for our vision. The thinking of this generation may have changed, but the result is never different. A vision must have a purpose.

The *Destiny* of the vision

The destiny of the vision is its moral and humane impact. The general good or improvement that it will do to future generations. A visionary will have many visions, but not all of those visions will have a destiny. Only a vision that has a destiny will have character. The word destiny means "appointed or preordained." It means that there is a greater power behind the vision other than our human design. I call this "the GOD/UNIVERSE factor of vision." When you have the GOD/UNIVERSE factor in your vision,

you know, without a doubt, that your vision has a destiny, a divine destiny. When you realize this, you know you cannot fail because you are destined to The GOD/UNIVERSE succeed. factor inspiration behind the vision. Two of the greatest inventors of the Ninetieth Century, Benjamin and Thomas Edison. were Christians. Benjamin Franklin invented the bifocal (glasses), lightning rod, iron furnace stove, and Thomas Edison patented inventions, the most famous of his inventions being the light bulb. Edison was quoted as saying, "Genius is one percent inspiration and 99 percent perspiration." It is this one percent. GOD/UNIVERSE factor, that was responsible for the destiny of these men and their inventions. There are very few people on this Earth who are not affected by the destiny of these men's inventions.

The destiny of the vision is its moral and humane impact. The general good or improvement that it will do to future generations.

The GOD/UNIVERSE factor does three things to the vision. First, it puts an eternal perspective into the vision. You know that there is a

greater power at work in your vision other than your human design and ingenuity. Second, it provides hope to vision. You know something greater than yourself urges you to pursue and persevere when everybody else has given up. Third, the GOD/UNIVERSE factor puts humility into the vision. You know that without GOD/UNIVERSE, you could not have done it. The GOD/UNIVERSE factor in vision is about a partnership between

GOD/UNIVERSE and man. A professional rope maker will confirm that the strongest rope is made out of a Threefold strand because only combination do all the three strands attach themselves to each other. When GOD/UNIVERSE and man and vision are attached together, it is an unbreakable and unshakable combination. Literally, all things are possible. D L Moody, a famous evangelist of the 19th Century, is reported to have said to his sons on his deathbed. "If God be your partner, make your plans large." I have a plague on my desk that states, "If you can do it, GOD's not in it." Well, at this point, some of you may be asking, what if I am an atheist. Perhaps it is time to reconsider your position. Can you honestly say that there is no GOD? To arrive at this position, a person must state that they have searched every corner of this World and did not find GOD. What atheists can honestly say that they have done this? Never the less I understand your angle. Perhaps it would be better for you to look at the GOD/UNIVERSE factor

as the Universe factor because vou cannot remove the unseen forces behind the vision that drives it. It is always there. like gravity that pulls and pushes matter.


